Agnes Watson started curling at the Calgary Curling Club as a thirty year old, in the 1947-48 season. At the time curling was viewed as a senior sport and she was considered very young. Her dues that year were \$10.00, and her corn broom cost her \$ 2.95. She was hooked on competitive curling, never winning a major, but winning her share of zone berths and bonspiels. Off the ice, Agnes was active in the boardroom and as an event volunteer. One of her regrets was being born too early, as she would have loved to be curling competitively today.

During the 1973-74 season, Agnes was named a “Life Member” of the Calgary Ladies Curling Club. In 1998, Agnes was honoured at age 83 after completing 50 years of curling and was recognized again in 2013, for her 65 years of membership. A longtime fan of the Calgary Stampeders and season ticket holder since 1948, Agnes also enjoyed speed skating and golf.

A celebration of Agnes’ life was held on Thursday, February 2<sup>nd</sup>. Agnes will be missed by her brother, Gordon, son, Brian and his family, four grandchildren, two great grandchildren and her many friends.
